eMitter BEEP

Congratulations on your purchase decision! With eMitter products you are successfully supporting green Pest Control. Using eMitter does not only deliver a very effective control of pests but it also ensures that no toxic bait is exposed to our environment. Toxic bait actively harms nature and all creatures living in it.

Animal protection laws dictate that traps should be checked at least daily. With eMitter BEEP you don't need to manually check your traps daily anymore but only control the traps when the BEEP noise alerts you. If rat or mouse traps are not controlled after the catch of a rodent it might cause that animals stay in a trap too long. This will create odor and also lure insects to the rodent carcass.

eMitter BEEP automatically alerts you about a rodent catch, just like a fire-alert or a SMS. With this it is the most modern and easiest mouse or rat-trap to use with notification

How does it work?

- **Activate the eMitter BEEP by pushing the ON/OFF button for 1-2 seconds. eMitter BEEP will beep 3 times to indicate that it is active.**
- **Carefully place eMitter BEEP in the station (for all stations and traps that may be used: www.emitter.info)**

When a rodent is being caught in the trap the vibration of the trap will activate the eMitter BEEP alerts. eMitter BEEP will beep 3 times right when you catch the rodent. Once activated eMitter BEEP will continue to beep 3 times every 30 seconds.

To deactivate just press the ON/OFF button for 1-2 seconds and a long beep will sound for confirmation. eMitter BEEP is now off and will not make a sound until you restart it.

To re-activate eMitter BEEP just start all over again (see above).

The internal battery will last at least 3 years and can be changed when it is empty. To change please open the case (with e.g. a coin) and insert a new battery of the same type (CR 2032).
